

Reagan Orchestra Booster Club Pre-UIL Concert General Meeting Minutes Approved February 25th and 27th, 2020

Prior to the February 25th concert, Nathan Shapiro, ROBC President, introduced himself, welcomed everyone to the ROBC General Meeting, and began with confirming the ROBC Mission as well as introducing all Board Members and Chair Positions.

Nathan provided an update regarding the current ROBC financial position to include current 2/20/20 cash balance of \$31,390, 2019-2021 donations to date of \$12,000, \$21,500 expenses related to orchestra trips, \$16,000 expenses on Orchestra "wish list" items, and the budget to carry over \$10,000 into the 2020-2021 school year, primarily for summer camp and the orchestra council retreat. Nathan also confirmed fundraising for 2019-2020 school year was just over \$15,000 with top sources being Snapraise, spirit nights, and bundt cake sales. He gave everyone an overview of the orchestra "wish list" items that were purchased this year as well. These purchases were bass endpin wheels (\$300), Mac desktop computer (\$1,500), harp strings/tuning key holders (\$2,500), high density storage shelves (\$10,000), and closet rails for the men's uniform storage (\$1,500). He noted that the board decided to move one "wish list" item, furniture for converted library (\$2,000), to the next school year. Lastly, he informed everyone that the board also established an Orchestra Scholarship Program this year and set aside \$2,000 (\$1,000 for top student, with \$500 each to be received by 2 additional students). Dana Comstock was voted in as Scholarship Chair and the process will be announced in April with winners being announced at the Year End Banquet.
